

Criteria to be an RSO at the El Dorado Gun Club.

1. It is a privilege, not a right to be an EDGC RSO
2. Must have an NRA RSO certification and be a El Dorado Gun Club member.
 - a. NRA RSO certification class can be taken at EDGC for “no cost”
3. Must be approved by the El Dorado Gun Club Board.
4. Must have a minimum of 16 hours, working as an assistant RSO.
 - a. RSO candidate must contact the Lead RSO (in person, by phone or email), for the range session they wish to assist on and make arrangements for their training session
 - b. Must include opening and closing the range (supervised by Lead RSO)
 - c. Must include both Open Pistol and Open Rifle sessions
5. Must demonstrate safe gun handling and have knowledge about common firearms on the line.
6. Must know how to open and close the range.
7. Must know the protocol for handling an accident or incident.
8. Must know the Club’s range rules and how to call a cease fire.
9. Must know how to sign people in, take money, and deposit these two items into an envelope, clearly marked and then put this into the safe.
10. Must have read and understand the SOP’S.
11. Must successfully pass an oral and “hands on” examination by CRSO
12. Must be professional when conducting themselves as an RSO.
