Criteria to be an RSO at the El Dorado Gun Club.

- 1. It is a privilege, not a right to be an EDGC RSO
- 2. Must have an NRA RSO certification and be a El Dorado Gun Club member.
 - a. NRA RSO certification class can be taken at EDGC for "no cost"
- 3. Must be approved by the El Dorado Gun Club Board.
- 4. Must have a minimum of 16 hours, working as an assistant RSO.
 - a. RSO candidate must contact the Lead RSO (in person, by phone or email), for the range session they wish to assist on and make arrangements for their training session
 - b. Must include opening and closing the range (supervised by Lead RSO)
 - c. Must include both Open Pistol and Open Rifle sessions
- 5. Must demonstrate safe gun handling and have knowledge about common firearms on the line.
- 6. Must know how to open and close the range.
- 7. Must know the protocol for handling an accident or incident.
- 8. Must know the Club's range rules and how to call a cease fire.
- 9. Must know how to sign people in, take money, and deposit these two items into an envelope, clearly marked and then put this into the safe.
- 10. Must have read and understand the SOP'S.
- 11. Must successfully pass an oral and "hands on" examination by CRSO
- 12. Must be professional when conducting themselves as an RSO.
